## Edna's Ripple Knitted Hat

Size 6 needles, 13" long
1 skein worsted weight Lily Sugar and
Cream all cotton yarn (3 oz) - buy 2 if variegated (they tend to be $2.50 z$ - one skein seems to not complete a full hat lately)

Yarn needle for sewing seam
Cast on 102 stitches.
Row 1: Knit across
Row 2: Purl across
Row 3: Knit across
Row 4: Purl across
Row 5: Knit across
Row 6: Purl across
Row 7: Purl across (makes ridge on right side )
Row 8: Purl across
Row 9: Knit across
Row 10: Purl across
Row 11: Knit across
Row 12: Purl across
Row 13: Knit across
Row 14: Knit across ( makes ridge on right side )
Row 15: Knit across
Row 16: Purl across
Row 17: Knit across
Row 18: Purl across
Row 19: Knit across
Row 20: Purl across
Row 21: Purl across ( makes ridge on right side )
Row 22: Purl across
Row 23: Knit across
Row 24: Purl across
Row 25: Knit across
Row 26: Purl across
Row 27: Knit across
Row 28: Knit across ( makes ridge on right side )
Row 29: Knit across
Row 30: Purl across
Row 31: Knit across
Row 32: Purl across
Row 33: Knit 10 stitches, Knit 2 stitches together, repeat across the row. (this will decrease the stitch count by 8 to 94 stitches).
Row 34: Purl across
Row 35: Purl 9 stitches, purl 2 stitches together, -repeat across row ( 86 sts). (ridge row)
Row 36: Purl row.

Row 37: Knit 8, Knit 2 together across (78 sts).
Row 38: Purl row.
Row 39: Knit 7, Knit 2 together across row (70 sts).
Row 40: Purl row.
Row 41: Knit 6, knit 2 together across row ( 62 sts).
Row 42: Knit row. (ridge row)
Row 43: Knit 5, Knit 2 together across row (54 sts).
Row 44: Purl row.
Row 45: Knit 4, Knit 2 together across row (48 sts).
Row 46: Purl row.
Row 47: Knit 3, Knit 2 together across row (40 sts).
Row 48: Purl row.
Row 49: Purl 2, purl 2 together across row (32 sts). (ridge row)
Row 50: Purl row.
Row 51: Knit 2 together across row (16 sts).
Row 52: Purl 2 together across row (8 sts).
When 8 or fewer stitches remain - cut yarn $\sim 12$ inches from hat. With a yarn needle thread remaining stitches through the needle. Turn hat inside out and overhand side seam together. Be sure to match up "ridge rows" in the seam. Weave in any loose ends.
